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25 in 2024: Announcing more Health Happens Here GrantsTM



Organizations across Illinois are closing care gaps and addressing health-related social needs of Meridian members and their local communities. Through our <u>Health Happens Here Grants</u>, we're proud to invest in this work—from food pantry resources in Murphysboro to nursing career pathways in Belleville.

We closed out 2024 by awarding nearly \$1.4 million to 25 organizations. "These grants will support behavioral health and wellness programs, support for young mothers, professional and career development, mobile health units, and non-emergency transport services, all of which are critical to the health of these communities," said Cristal Gary, Meridian Plan President and CEO.

Help members take heart health to heart

During American Heart Month this February, let's join forces to promote prevention and management of cardiovascular disease (CVD). Here are resources to support you and your patients:



- Guide patients to our <u>HealthSheets™ library</u>, with resources in English and Spanish to help them understand <u>heart disease risk factors</u>, <u>cholesterol</u> <u>tests</u>, and <u>high blood pressure</u>.
- Remind your Meridian patients to sign up for our <u>Healthy Rewards program</u>. They can earn prepaid debit cards for completing their annual checkup, screenings, and more.
- Refer patients with CVD to Meridian's <u>Chronic</u>
 <u>Disease Management Program</u>. Eligible members
 can receive health coaching and resources like a
 home blood pressure monitor at no cost.
- Recommend specialized programs for patients with CVD risk factors, such as an accredited <u>Diabetes</u>
 <u>Prevention Program</u> covered by Medicaid.

Pharmacy spotlight: 2025 American Diabetes Association (ADA) updates

The ADA has released its annual Standards of Care, which aim to improve outcomes for children and adults with diabetes. The 2025 recommendations have been updated to further include people with a high risk of developing diabetes. Notable changes include:

- Guidance on the use of GLP-1 receptor agonists beyond weight loss
- Considerations related to continuous glucose monitors and other technology
- Potentially harmful medications during pregnancy

Stay enrolled as a Medicaid provider: Know your date to revalidate



Revalidation every five years is a federal requirement for Medicaid providers that was paused during COVID-19. Illinois resumed this process in September 2024. Providers who did not revalidate in 2024 should prepare to take this step in 2025—or risk being terminated from Medicaid without the ability to receive payment.

- Do you know your organization's current revalidation status?
- Do you know when your 90-day revalidation cycle will begin?
- Are you certain your organization's contact information in the IMPACT system is accurate?

If you answered "no" to any of these questions, review our recent provider notice for resources.

Prepare for revalidation

Notable HFS notices

- HFS issued the following coverage change notices effective **January 1, 2025**:
 - Genetic testing for inherited cancer-related gene mutations
 - Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) vaccination for persons ages 46 and older
- Find electronic Visit Verification (EVV) <u>technical assistance resources</u> and review <u>Meridian's most recent EVV provider notice</u>.
- Find updates on certification, enrollment, and billing requirements for <u>doulas</u> and <u>lactation consultants</u> seeking to become Medicaid providers.

Fee schedule updates, rate changes, & billing updates

Claim alerts and known issues are posted on our <u>website</u>, along with updates from Meridian about proactively reprocessing claims. Claims should not be resubmitted unless otherwise indicated. For billing questions, contact your assigned Provider Engagement Administrator or representative. If your practice doesn't have an assigned representative, please complete our <u>intake form</u>.

• HFS issued a <u>provider notice</u> informing Specialized Mental Health Rehabilitation Facilities of rate changes effective **January 1, 2025**.
