Metabolic Monitoring for Children and Adolescents on Antipsychotics (APM)

Did you know?

This Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set (HEDIS®) measure assesses whether children and adolescents with multiple antipsychotic prescriptions have had the appropriate testing.

How is APM compliance measured?



The percentage of children and adolescents one to 17 years of age who had two or more antipsychotic prescriptions and had metabolic testing during the measurement year.
