A completed NOP will connect your patients to Meridian's care management team and high-risk members to <u>Start Smart for Your Baby®</u> — our multi-faceted program that includes enhanced outreach, wellness materials, intensive care management, and provider collaboration to lower the risks of premature births and admissions to neonatal intensive care units.**

New 2024 P4P incentive: Capturing new and expectant moms' health-related social needs

We're proud to unveil a new P4P incentive that rewards providers an extra \$10 for including Z Codes on claims for prenatal and postpartum visits. <u>Learn more</u> about Z Codes, which capture patients' social conditions such as education, housing, employment, and food access. By systematically documenting Z Code information, together we can develop interventions that take a whole-person approach to healthcare.

Routine screening to detect breast and cervical cancers at their earliest, most treatable stages saves lives.

Updated YouthCare Provider Manual released

YouthCare pharmacy update: Psychotropic medications

Effective June 1, 2024, the status of the medications buprenorphine, buprenorphine-naloxone, methadone, naltrexone, and naltrexone-triamcinolone will change for YouthCare members under the care of the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS). The drugs will require the form <u>CFS 431-A</u> (also known as a consent form) to be submitted to DCFS.

If you have questions about billing, contact your assigned Provider Relations representative. If your practice doesn't have an assigned representative please, complete our <u>intake form</u>.
